House Visits

The house visits is one of the most important steps in the whole Term. It shows the living circumstances of the children and explains their behavior. In this term we visited 23 houses and were able to see both, the developments within the families and the grievances that are yet to improve.

Many houses have already been built or upgraded by previous volunteers, so that most of the children at least have an own bed including pillow and blanket and sometimes even an own room by now. But there were still some issues to see. The abuse of alcohol, illnesses within the family or parents not having an employment or living somewhere else are main problems concerning the family situation of the children.

We hope that the projects we initiated will help to improve the kids' living circumstances.









Projects

Thanks to the donations we received from our family and friends we were able to start with our projects. We built a new room for Jonas, Richard and Loloki, put a cement floor into Hendrienas house and stabilised her roof. Moreover we bought four new beds, mattresses and blankets for some of the children who did not have their own ones before. Furthermore we were able to buy clothes bags as well as a carepackages which contained hygienic products for every kid in the center.
